

First Church has been in Seattle for 170 years. There is still work to do.

Dear First Church,

We are a church that has not been afraid to invest in people and ministry, to continue our mission to Seattle even when society is in crisis.

One of the stories I tell about First Church is from the 1970s when Boeing suffered a huge slump, with massive layoffs of half its workforce. Then a recession hit. Nixon resigned. It was a time of crisis. A billboard was posted outside Seattle city limits, "WILL THE LAST PERSON LEAVING SEATTLE TURN OUT THE LIGHTS?"

First Church responded to that crisis by investing in the people. Laid-off Boeing workers had great skills – electrical, construction, etc. So the church hired them to make renovations of the sanctuary and chapel and offices, thereby keeping food on their tables at home until the job market leveled out. It was a time of uncertainty for Seattle, yet we took the leap of faith for those in crisis.

For the church's 170-year existence, we have been responsive to the needs of our community. Now in 2023, Seattle has experienced an increase in severe weather events, homelessness and food insecurity, and ongoing conflict over social justice issues. <u>No matter the crisis, we continue our mission, investing in people and ministry in Seattle.</u> This spirit of cooperation, shared vision, and mutuality of caring for others has marked First Church throughout our past and continues to mark First Church today.

As we honor our past, we remain committed to our future:

- **Children and youth** ministries make up 25% of our church's program budget. In 2024 we'll hold our first summer Vacation Bible School in a decade and, during Lent, a new Confirmation class for teens will meet; both are investments in raising the next generation in the church.
- Weekly Sunday morning **Shared Breakfasts** served 9742 meals in 2022, touching hundreds of people who are food insecure in the city. Shared Breakfast leaders show great tenacity, coordinating volunteers and writing requests for funding. For instance, this year the Shared Breakfast program received \$10,000 from United Way thanks to Jim Schone's grant requests.

- **Music** tends to our soul. The church music program has expanded this year with the gifts of more soloists and the introduction of an audio/visual technician, enhancing the worship experience inperson and at home.
- The earth is our future! For the first time, congregants were asked to give **Earth Pledges** in 2022, committing to individual actions or efforts to seek climate justice. You can sign up for one this year at <u>FirstChurchSeattle.org/give/earthpledge</u>
- The "Spirit Moves Us Forward" 2023 **capital campaign** raised over \$400,000 in pledges, enabling us to pay off our 2010 building mortgage in 2025, thereby freeing up resources for the church to invest even more in our ministry and mission.

Commitment Sunday // special presentation in worship, reception after worship with treasures from 170 years. The lights are still on in Seattle, and our work goes on. First Church continues to invest in people and ministries. The Message Bible translation in Matthew 5 reads "You're here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world. God is not a secret to be kept. We're going public with this, as public as a city on a hill."

As we look towards the upcoming year, I pray that you will continue to grow spiritually, step into spaces of advocacy, and care for the person in need of refuge. I would also like to invite you to prayerfully consider how you might support First Church financially in 2024.
