Dear friends and members of First Church,

We are reminded that the people continued to sing songs of thanksgiving, trusting that the rain will eventually come and that God is looking after them. They did sing a song of praise *AS IF* the rain that they longed for had already come. That is true thanksgiving and that is also our story, our song, our faithful thanksgiving even today, even still in these ever changing days.


